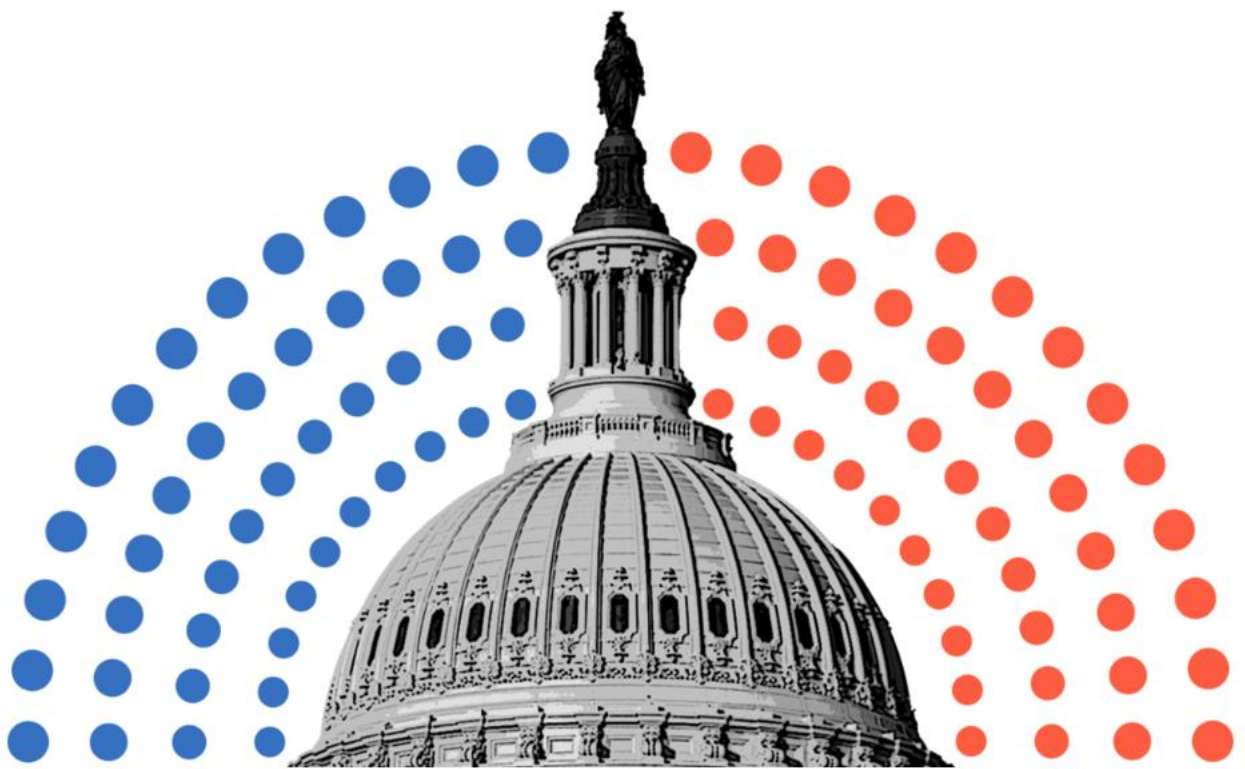
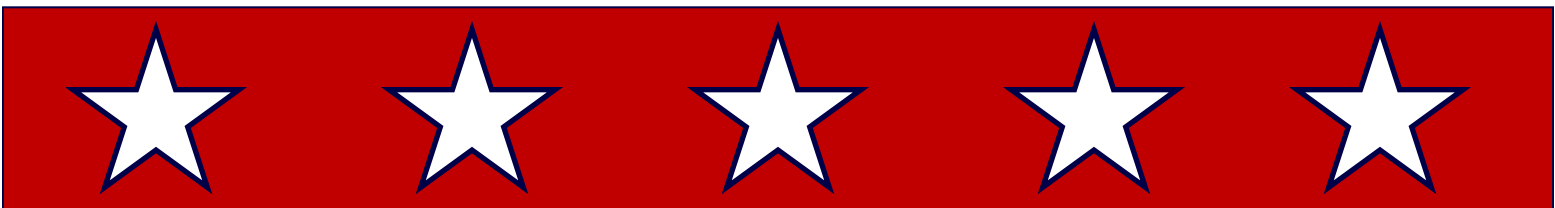

## The Balance of Power: GOP's Hope for 'Red Wave' Sputters

Republicans took control of the House but by smaller margins than forecast., as voters delivered a mixed verdict in an election shaped by concerns about inflation and by the nation's divisions on cultural and social issues. The Democrats picked up one seat in the Senate with a win in Pennsylvania and the Republicans netted 10 seats in the House, giving the GOP control (barely) of the House of Representatives. The balance of power following the elections is as follows:

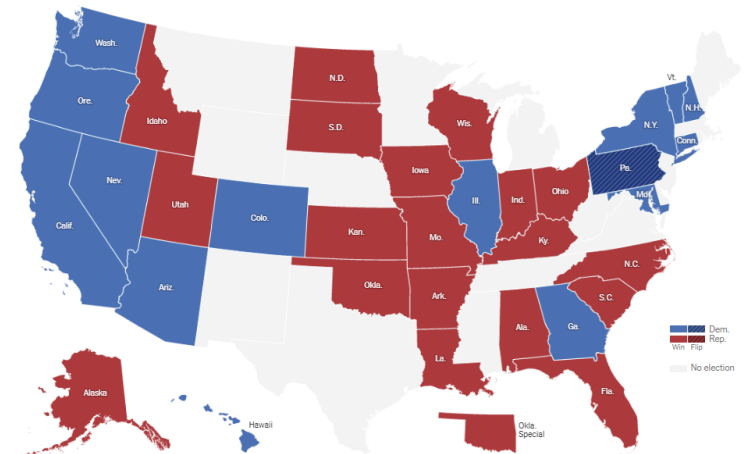
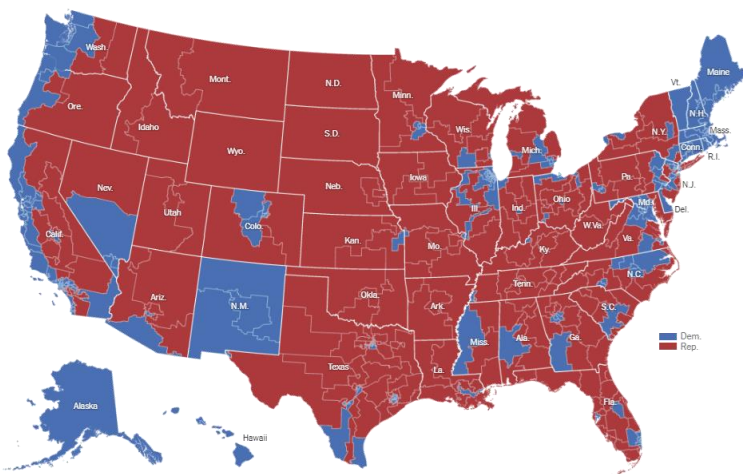
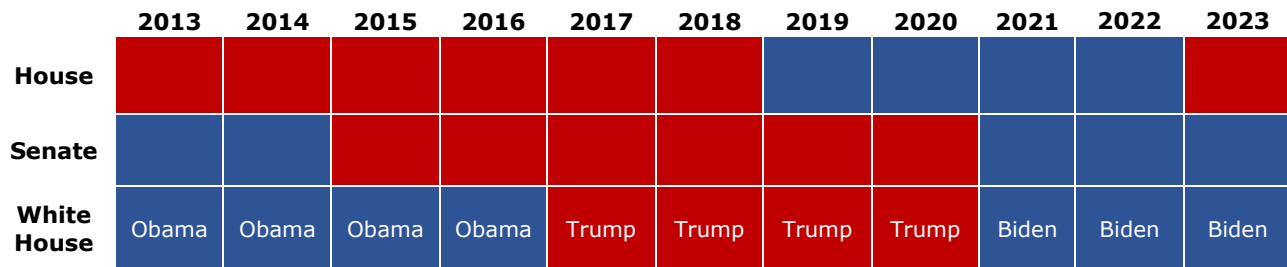

As 2022 came to and end, the PAC has raised \$212,254 from 181 neurosurgeons. The historical efforts are outlined in the following charts:

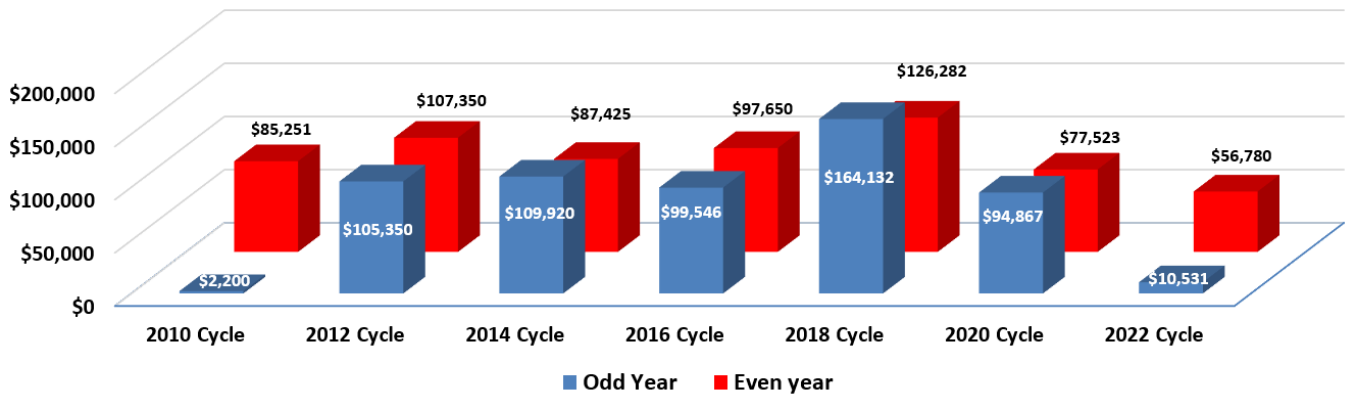

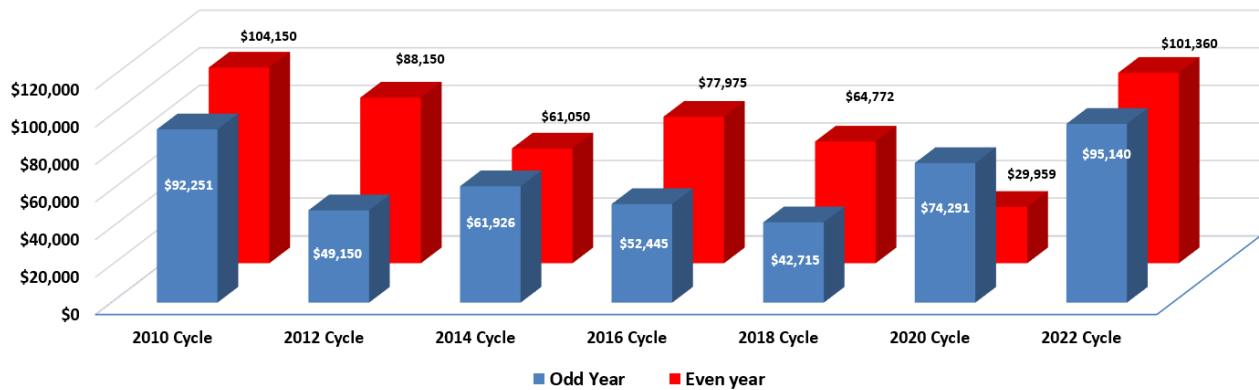
There was a significant drop from past 1<sup>st</sup> quarter contribution levels when the PAC paused all activity- in 2012, but the PAC rebounded significantly in 2022 Q1 and throughout the remainder of the year.

## 1st Quarter NeurosurgeryPAC Fundraising by Year/Cycle



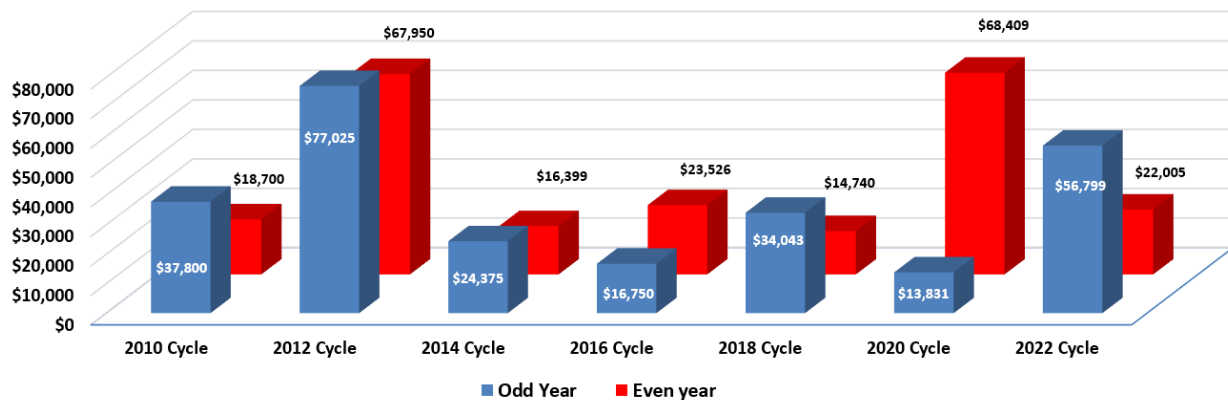

## 2nd Quarter NeurosurgeryPAC Fundraising by Year/Cycle



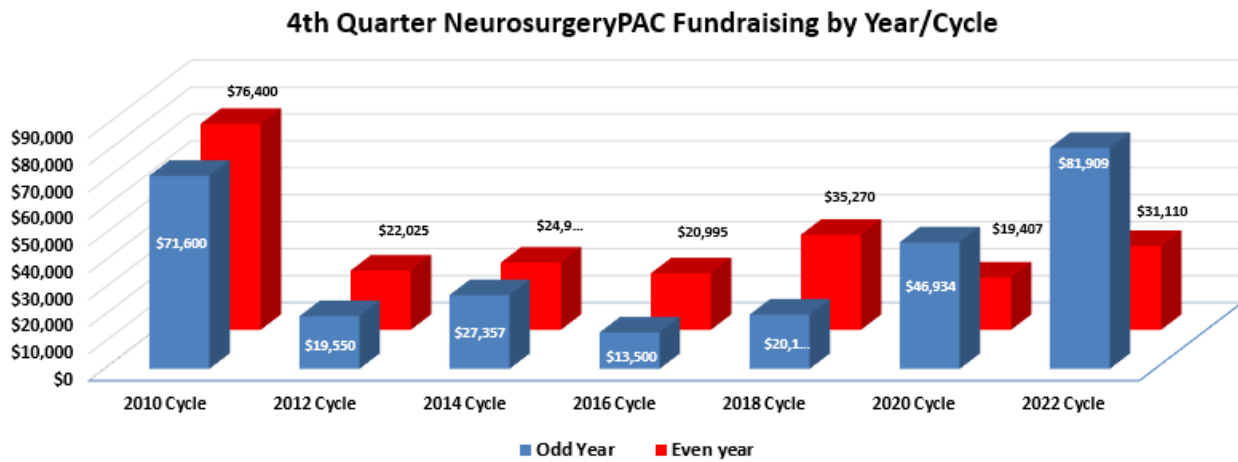

## 3rd Quarter NeurosurgeryPAC Fundraising by Year/Cycle

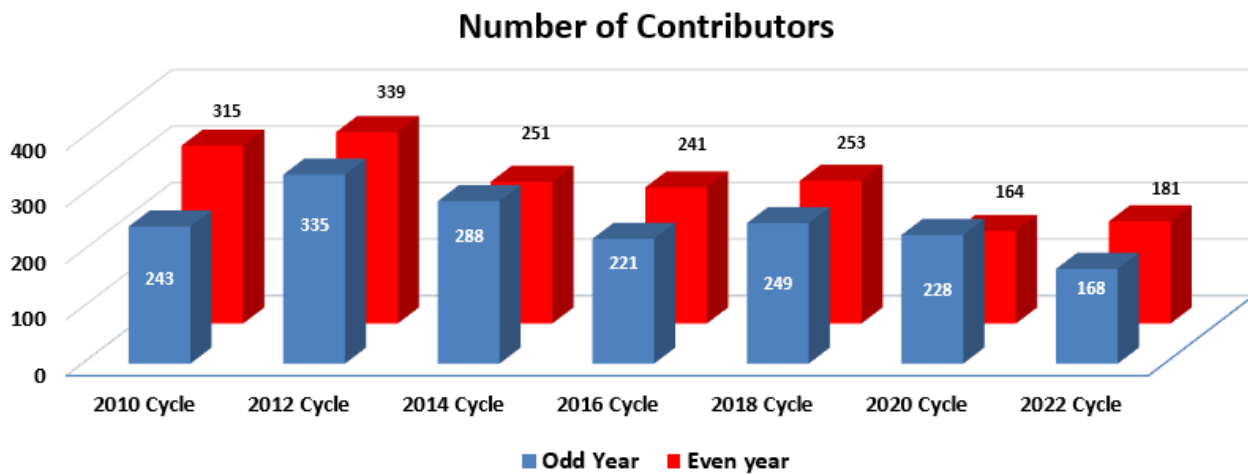

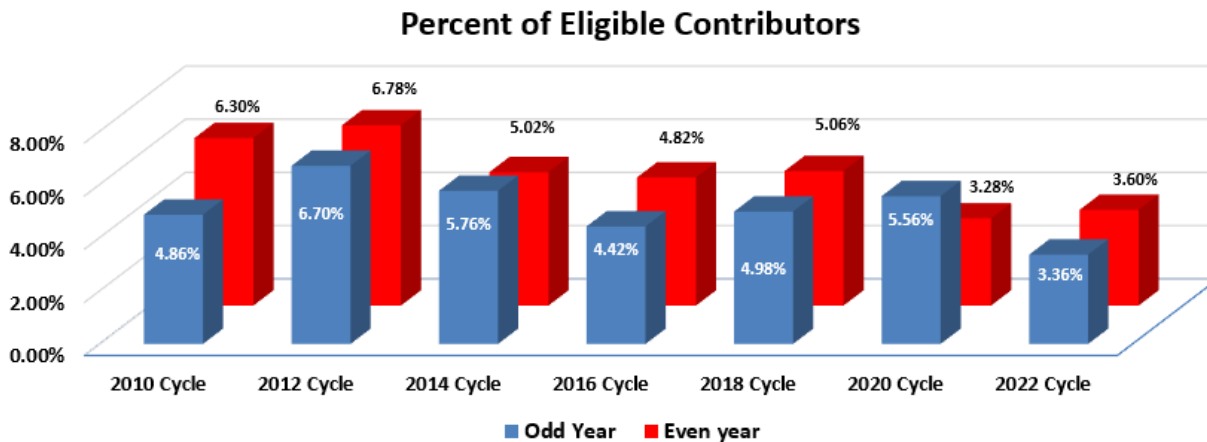
not quite as much as the 2021 November push from PAC Board members that **significantly** boosted 2021 Q4 contributions.



Unfortunately, the number of contributors to NeurosurgeryPAC still has not quite rebounded, but is climbing.

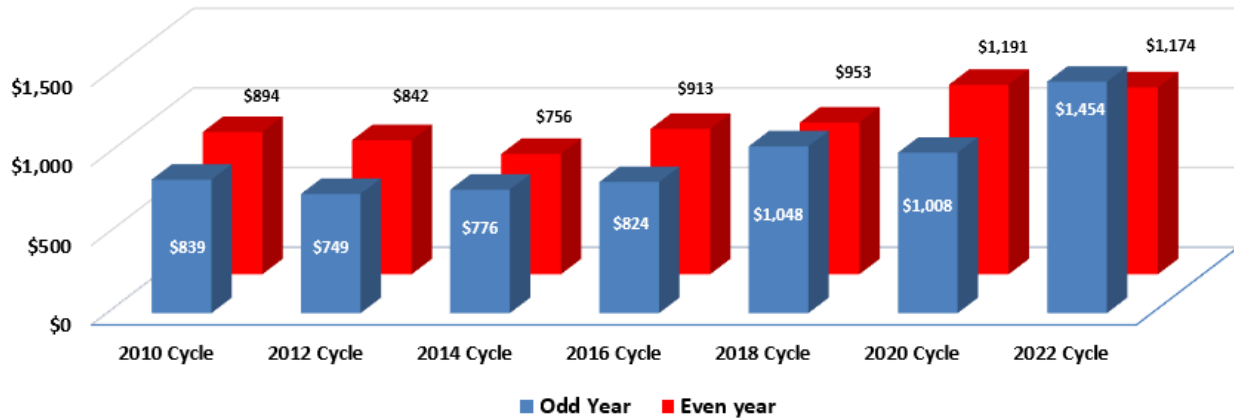


While the percentage of participation has still not returned to past levels, it continues to climb.



The continued bright spot is the average contribution per neurosurgeon, which is down from 2021, but is still very high at \$1,174.

As a reminder, NeurosurgeryPAC is nonpartisan and contribution decisions are made based on candidates’ legislative record and stated positions on issues of concern to neurosurgeons and their patients.

### Election Results for NeurosurgeryPAC

With only a handful of losses, NeurosurgeryPAC had one its most successful election cycles. Ninety-six percent of NeurosurgeryPAC-backed candidates winning their general election bids (as compared to 95% in the 2020 election cycle). The overall success rate, including both primary and general elections, was 90% (as compared to 92% in 2020).
